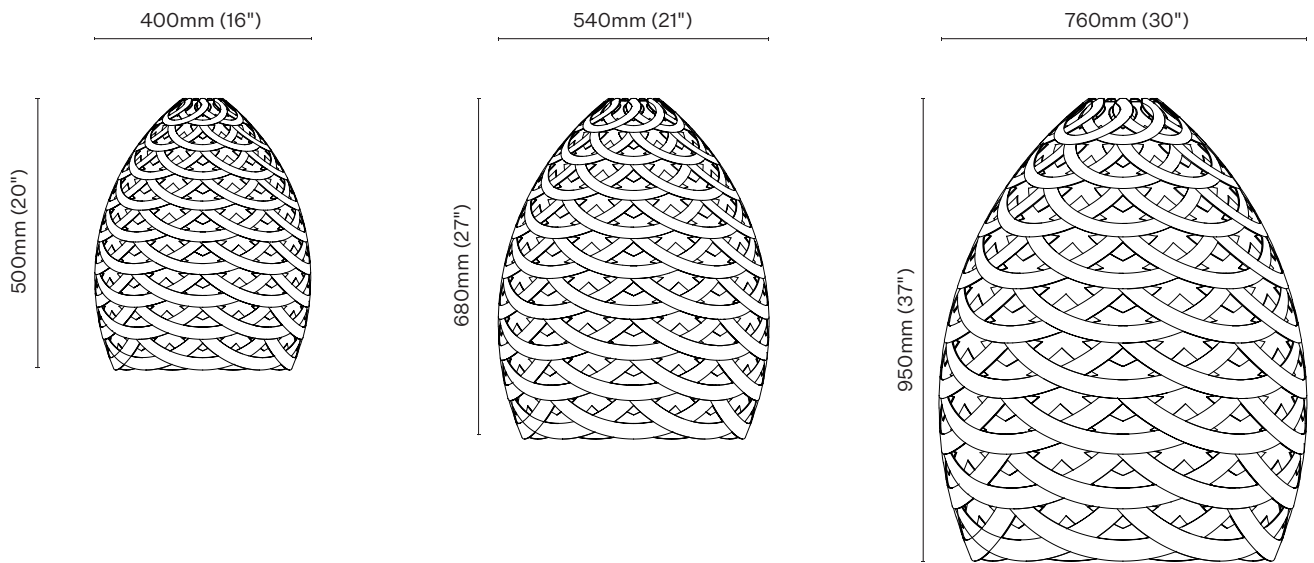

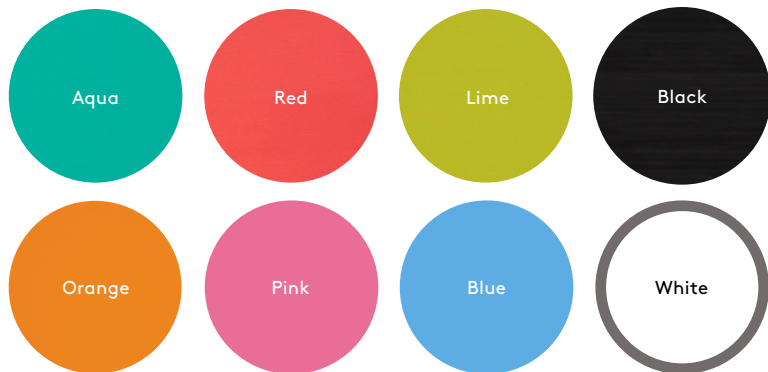
Finishes

We offer 12 stock finish options for Tūī. We use low VOC acrylic paint and it is most commonly used on the interior of the light. We can also produce lights in other finishes or colours by special order. All lights are made from sustainably grown bamboo plywood sourced from an FSC accredited factory.

Story

Tūi are the real characters of Aotearoa's native bush. They hurtle through the bush with drumming wing-beats, miraculously avoiding branches whilst maintaining their cool charm. Their song is like no other: a series of clicks, gurgles and resonant, bell-like notes...some off our hearing scale! They have two dangling white wattles on their throats and around their shoulders is a necklace of interwoven rings which is the inspiration of our Tūi light. Half rings of bamboo are woven into a basket form that would sit perfectly over a dining table, kitchen counter or equally hanging in a stairwell or entrance void.
